

## **WORK HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY**

- We establish measurable safety performance objectives and targets and that we review these to continually improve WHS performance. This shall include regular workplace inspections and to reduce and eliminate identified hazards
- Employees are trained on all health and safety matters relevant to their work
- Contractors are fully aware of the hazards associated with their work, and implement appropriate hazard control measures
- Effective employee and contractor consultation on health and safety matters including two-way communication of relevant information, toolbox meetings, report and feedback mechanisms

All company employees and contractors are required to comply with this WHS policy and the WHS management system at all times.

Senior managers and supervisors are responsible for the implementation of all matters dealing with the health and safety of employees and contractors under their control.

Employees must cooperate with the employer regarding WHS actions taken by the employer to maintain health and safety. In addition, employees shall take reasonable care of their own safety and adversely affect the safety of others at the workplace. Employees actively assist and mentor colleagues, contractors and other visitors, in safe work practices.
